

# MINUTES OF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING Western Snow Conference 13 April 1960 Santa Fe, New Mexico

A meeting of the Executive Committee of the Western Snow Conference was held in Santa Fe, New Mexico, on April 13, 1960. General Chairman Francis T. Mayo called the meeting to order. Members present included:

- 1. Bill Iang nominated Jerry van de Erve for General Chairman. This nomination was seconded by Fred Strauss. Francis Blanchard moved nominations be closed. Phil Mutz seconded the motion. A unanimous vote was cast for Mr. van de Erve for General Chairman.
- 2. Bibliography. The Executive Committee recommended that Mr. Ashton R. Codd, with the support and cooperation of the General Chairman, be authorized to proceed with necessary arrangements for preparation of the remaining abstracts for the Bibliography through assistance by the various organizations within the Conference, working as members of Mr. Codd's committee.
- 3. Bill Lang moved that Gene Christian be awarded life membership in the Western Snow Conference. Seconded by Mr. van de Erve.
- 4. Francis Blanchard moved that the Western Snow Conference buy each member a copy of the Soil Conservation Society of America publication on snow surveying and water supply forecasts to be mailed out with the Proceedings for 1960 approximate cost \$75.00. Ashton R. Codd seconded the motion. The Executive Committee voted unanimous approval.
- 5. Bill lang moved, and was seconded by Mr. Ashton R. Codd, that Manes Barton be Chairman of a committee authorized to spend \$500.00 of Conference funds on a suitable memorial in memory of Dr. Church. Bill lang and Fred Strauss were assigned to be members of Mr. Barton's committee and the issue was presented at the Business Meeting of all members who voted unanimously for this action.
- 6. Jack Hannaford accepted the position as editor of the Snow Surveyor's Forum. Gregory L. Pearson, editor for 1959, did not receive enough material for an issue.
- 7. The Executive Committee discussed the recommendation of the General Chairman to amend the Constitution and By-Laws to provide a Secretary-Treasurer for the Conference. The Executive Committee authorized the General Chairman to form a committee consisting of the four-area chairmen to review the Constitution and By-Laws and an amendment to provide for a Secretary-Treasurer. This recommendation to be ready for the General Chairman prior to the 1961 meeting.
- 8. Francis Mayo presented and reviewed the financial statement for the period April 1, 1959 to March 31, 1960. The financial statement was accepted and approved.
- 9. The Executive Committee perused a letter presented by Mr. R. T. Davis from the Governor of the State of Washington and the Spokane Chamber of Commerce to have the 1961 meeting in Spokane, Washington. The general membership was polled on this subject and moved unanimously to hold the 1961 meeting in Spokane, Washington during April.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

#### MINUTES OF BUSINESS MEETING

The annual business meeting of the Western Snow Conference was called to order Wednesday afternoon, April 13, 1960, at Santa Fe, New Mexico, by Francis Mayo, General Chairman. Items of business included:

Adoption of resolutions proposed by the Resolutions Committee (as printed in this issue).

The administrative work of the Conference has become so voluminous that it is burdensome on the General Chairman. The Executive Committee suggested that a study be made leading to submission to the next annual meeting of proposals for amendment of the constitution for addition of another officer, such as a secretary-treasurer. This suggestion was approved, and a committee was later appointed to carry on this study. The committee is comprised of the four incumbent area chairmen, under the leader-ship of the General Chairman.

A recommendation that \$500 be appropriated for a memorial to Dr. J. E. Church was approved. Manes Barton was appointed by the General Chairman to make the necessary determination basic to a recommendation for an appropriate memorial with Fred Strauss and W. A. Lang as fellow advisory members.

The new General Chairman, J. van de Erve, was introduced to the Conference.

A letter was received from Clark H. Gleason, Chairman of the Colman Watershed Fellowship Fund, to the effect that the first award of this fund was made to one Leonard F. DeBano. Mr. DeBano received \$1800 to enable him to take full-time studies toward his PH.D. in soil science.

As you know, the Western Snow Conference is one of the many sponsors of the Colman Watershed Fellowship Fund.
