67.6.2 Wilderness

Frank Gehrke reported California has a blanket permit for wilderness snow sensors which expires in 1999 but will be renewed. A part of this permit requires completion of a correlation study. 67.6.3 Awards

67.6.3.2 Art Crook Award

67.6.3.3 Best Paper and Best Poster Award

It was reiterated that it is the responsibility of the host area committee to select the best oral and poster presentations, as well as the best student paper. The host area committee must submit to the Editor and the Awards Chair the names and addresses of those selected. No motion was needed.

It is also the responsibility of the host area committee to make everyone aware that a disk and hard copy need to be submitted at the meeting in order to win a best paper/poster award.

67.6.3.4 El Farsante Award

Discussion concerned having the Area Chairs look at the award and decide how it is to be awarded. The award should be given after the Committee has followed the rationale for which the El Farsante Award was designed for in the first place. Discussion also stressed that all of the candidates be carefully considered. No motion was needed.

67.7 Other Business

67.7.1 Bulk Mail

Some form of line-of-credit would be needed if we chose to accept payment by credit card, because of lag between when money is received and payments are due.

There was a lengthy discussion on off-site fees associated with meeting registration. At the 1999 WSC meeting the fee was charged to those not staying at the Embassy Suites, and was intended to compensate for meeting costs. The discussion took two paths. First was the concern associated with charging students the fee because it would create a financial burden that might keep them from registering and attending the meeting.

A more lengthy discussion occurred regarding the way in which we contract hotels and how the meeting rooms, etc. are paid for. In the past, we have committed to fill a specific number of rooms, in turn, we are provided with the meeting rooms. It was suggested that in the future, we negotiate for the best room rate, regardless of occupancy, and then negotiate for the meeting rooms. In this way, each registrant is free to say where they choose and the cost of the meeting rooms can be included in the WSC registration fee. No motion was made, but future conference committees are encouraged to look at all options for contracting both sleeping and meeting rooms.
