Please join us April 15-18, 2013 for the 81st annual Western Snow Conference in Jackson, Wyoming. The theme for this year's conference is **"Wild Weather in the Wild West"**.

You are invited to submit an abstract of 150-300 words by February 16, 2013. Submit abstracts to Brandon Moore at brandon.moore@vandals.uidaho.edu. Please indicate either "oral" or "poster" with your submission, and lead author's name, address, phone, and email. Some topics to consider for submission of papers: Climate Variability, Climate Change Impacts on Snow and Runoff, Water Management, Water Supply Forecasting, Modeling and Climatology of Snow.

The North Continental Committee has been busy compiling a full agenda and praying for snow. A Short Course and panel discussion titled **"New Strategies and Techniques in Long Range Streamflow Forecasting"** is scheduled for Monday morning April 15th. Many agencies and individuals use long range streamflow forecasts for hydropower planning, marketing, reservoir operations, or crop planning. This forum will provide a discussion on the current state of long range streamflow forecasts used by different entities, recent advancement of new techniques for producing these forecasts, forecast accuracy and more. A Technical Tour is scheduled for Thursday, April 18th to discover how the snowpack plays a critical role in the local environment. This will be an all day bus trip and a great opportunity to view the majestic landscape that so many have been studying.
